HELP! I have students at all different levels in math, literacy and social-emotional readiness this school year.

Students have variety of experiences with emergency remote learning, and will likely re-enter the school year with a colourful spectrum of readiness to engage with the grade level ahead. Like never before, this fall will require educators to deeply understand student strengths, needs, and talents and plan learning with multiple entry points to meet the needs of their learners.

Join this collaborative community to explore way of creating one lesson with multiple entry points, in lieu of 30 individualized lessons. In this series, we will support the use of Shelley Moore's application of Universal Design for Learning (UDL) to plan for diversity from the onset. Teachers will leave this series with a thorough classroom support plan that will assist with planning throughout the year.

In this 4-part series, teachers will:

- Design a useable Classroom Support Plan specific to your grade/subject level
- Expand your classroom strategies and supports toolkit that will benefit all students
- Learn new ways to support students literacy, numeracy and social emotional learning (through an RTI lens)
- Intentionally Integrate teacher and student goal setting
- Explore formative assessment options (how will you know when they know)
