Linda Shantz-Kerestezes has held positions as a K-12 teacher-librarian, curriculum leader, school library specialist, AlSI teacher-librarian consultant/writer with the Calgary Board of Education (CBE) and was a member of the Alberta's Ministry of Education School Library In-Service Sub-Committee and teaches the Chinook Learning Services Library Assistant's Certification Program (CBE). She is past chairperson of the Canadian Library Association's Advisory for School Library Issues Committee which published the 2014 CLA Leading Learning: Standards of Practice for School Library Learning Commons in Canada.
