Target Audience: K-6 Teachers, Educational Assistants and Administrators are encouraged to attend.

In this full day session, we will build on our understanding of what inclusion is, and look at how we can make it happen using Alberta's new curriculum. We will look at an overall framework that puts students in the centre of our planning, and look at design frameworks that can help to adjust the context to respond to diverse student need. For this session we will specifically focus on K-3 Math and ELAL curriculum, as well as K-6 Physical Ed and Wellness, and we will walk through some specific examples from real Alberta classrooms and teams.

Originally from Edmonton, and now based in Vancouver, British Columbia, Shelley Moore is a highly sought after teacher, researcher, speaker and storyteller and has worked with school districts and community organizations throughout both Canada and the United States. Shelley's presentations are constructed based on contexts of schools and communities and integrate theory and effective practices of inclusion, special education, curriculum and teacher professional development. Her first book entitled, "One Without the Other" was released in July 2016 to follow up her TEDx talk hosted in Langley in January 2016. Shelley completed an undergraduate degree in Special Education at the University of Alberta, her Masters at Simon Fraser University, and is currently a PhD candidate at the University of



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
